FINISHING	EFFECT
Antico	Original, in-house finish of our own that gives the natural stone an aged effect as if the tile has already been used intensively for many years.
Anzano	Semi-rough finish that makes the surface feel somewhat coarse yet matt. Gives the surface a unique feel all of its own.
Aquaflamed	A very robust finish that accentuates the intense, natural colour of the natural stone.
Arenado	Our own finishing process that gives the surface a rough, finely grained look and feel.
Bouchardino	This finish lends the natural stone a fine, bush hammered surface with uneven irregularities. This brings out extra colour accents and nuances in the stone. It is smooth to the touch, with an anti-slip effect.
Brossato	This finish softens the natural roughness of the natural stone, emphasising its intense colours. Pleasant to touch or walk on.
Bush hammered	Working the surface with a pointed hammer creates uneven irregularities in the structure of the tile. Feels rather rough, with an anti-slip effect.
Cleft	The robust, cleft surface has large splinters and hollows in all shapes and sizes, irregularly distributed over the surface. Ideally suited to street paving, driveways and façade cladding.
Flamewashed	A rather solid finish, which highlights the intense, natural colors of the natural stone.
Diamond scoured	Scouring removes irregularities in height or unevenness on the surface. The scouring material is made of grains of industrial diamond that are exceptionally hard and extremely sharp.
Dark hand honed	Scouring the surface lends the natural stone a deep, dark tint. Light colour nuances give the tile a warm, contemporary appearance.
Flamed	The temperature shock after flaming the tile leads to natural cracking on the surface. This gives the natural stone a rough texture. Ideal for outdoor applications thanks to its anti-slip properties.
Hand honed	Scouring the natural stone considerably reduces the traces of sawing. The result is an even surface.

FINISHING	EFFECT
Heritage	The natural ageing process is perfectly imitated with this special finish.
Natural cleft	The untreated, rough surface of certain natural stone types gives attractive results.
Old fine chisel	Based on the well-known, pure craft form. Often used for flagstones and facade cladding. The parallel lines on the surface are typical of this finish.
Sabbiatino	In-house finish that creates a special, pleasant feeling to the touch. Small irregularities in the surface are typical of this finish.
Sawn - diamond cut	Pure, untreated finish for the slab or tile the way it looks after the natural stone block has been sawn. The type of saw determines whether parallel grooves or circular marks can be seen.
Sensato	A mechanical treatment gives the natural stone a soft structure with a pleasurable feel.
Stonewashed	An aged appearance with an idiosyncratic, contemporary touch. Exclusively for Kilkenny Limestone.

Hardened at great depths, cooled slowly and compressed for millions of years: it has taken a long time for granite to form. This makes it an extremely hard material that is exceptionally resistant to scratching and wear. It is no coincidence that granite is often chosen for façades, squares, patios and driveways.

Limestone is a sedimentary stone that often contains fossils. It comes in various colours including cream, brownish grey and even dark grey. Limestone exists in two varieties: soft, porous white stone or the hard variety. French white stone is the most famous. It is often used as a patio tile in dry, sunny climates.

The harder version is perfect for our Western climate. It is also used indoors as a floor or interior finish with a warm, southern touch. Limestone is available in many formats and finishes. It is a popular material that is easy to maintain.

FAIR SANDSTONE?

What does Fair Sandstone mean?

In India, where popular sandstone products such as Kandla Grey and Kandla Ochre are purchased, working and living conditions are sometimes dubious. Beltrami aims to promote more sustainable trade on various fronts, although this is not to be confused with philanthropy.

Fair Sandstone means transparency, risk awareness, action and monitoring. It means traceability in the supply chain all the way back to the quarry. Rather than being silenced, any problems found are reported.

No Child Left Behind

In 2014, Beltrami joined the worldwide ‘Stop Child Labour’ campaign with ‘No Child Left Behind’. The project is based on the vision that every child has the right to a childhood and a decent education. This is achieved through long-term support to the NGO Manjari to give the local families a better life. The improvements achieved in recent years include: obligatory age checks, more teachers and the creation of eight centres to raise awareness among parents and children even before they reach school age. This has resulted in a significant drop in child labour in the region and a strong increase in the number of children attending school again.

How can I maintain my outdoor natural stone tiles?

Natural stone hardly requires any maintenance. Apart from a thorough clean after installation and some annual maintenance, you can simply let nature take its course. A heavy shower and some sunshine will do all the work for you.

Another characteristic of natural stone is that it follows a natural ageing process. After a few years, your patio, drive or stairs will look different, but that is exactly what makes natural stone such an intriguing material.

The first (thorough) clean

Once your outdoor tiles have been laid and grouted, they will need a thorough clean. Give them a good scrub with **Lithofin MN Power Clean** to easily remove all cement haze, grout and dust particles. Repeat until the surface is completely clean.

Spring clean

After the frost of winter and the leaves falling in autumn, you are advised to thoroughly clean and condition your natural stone patios, paths, stairs, walls and drive with **Lithofin MN Outdoor Cleaner**. This product quickly acts to remove damp and dark stains and discolouration caused by plants, trees or flowers. After just a few minutes, your stone surfaces will look bright and clean again.

Daily maintenance

Installation guidelines

General

When you choose natural stone for exterior flooring, you have to take into account whether your floor will be used as a terrace or a driveway. It is clear that a floor does not need to be as thick in the first case as it does in the second. Normally, a thickness of 3 cm is sufficient. If it is not to be used to support a vehicle, sometimes even a thickness of 2 cm is enough (depending on the type of natural stone). Slate can even be thinner (1 to 1.5 cm).

Order all your tiles at the same time. Tiles from different batches can vary in shade. Be sure to order enough material. Additional deliveries can vary in shade. You also need to take in account the wasted cut offs (depending on the size of the natural stone and the extent and shape of the surface that needs tiling). For square sized tiles about 5 to 10 % is wasted, for random lengths allow for wastage of 3 to 5 %. Consult the technical data sheet of the material to find out

By mixing the tiles from the different pallets, colours will be harmonised.

Every garden has its own character. A square terrace can be aligned with any part of the garden: with the rear façade, the hedge or the garden fence, or it can be placed centrally. Because the length and width are equal, a square terrace does not directly influence the layout of the garden.

Tiles placed diagonally give the garden a more spacious feeling.

An ideal terrace should be flat, so that tables and chairs are stable. However, the surface of a terrace should not be slippery, nor should it be too rough for children to play on. It could be painful when they fall.

The format of the terrace depends on its use. Generally, a terrace should be big enough for daily use. Each person needs about 2.5 m² for sitting, but there must also be room to walk around and sufficient space for the table and chairs. A rectangular terrace can be laid to make your garden appear wider or longer. This can be achieved by the arrangement of the tiles. If you want to make your garden look wider, lateral stripes will emphasise the width. This can be done with, for example, contrasting colours. If you want to accentuate the length of your garden path, then stripes can be laid in the direction of the path.

The width of the driveway: the average car is approximately 1.8 m wide, so a driveway 2.5 m wide - the width of an average parking space - seems sufficient. However, to unload the car, it is useful to be able to fully open the doors. For this reason a better width for a driveway is between 3.2 and 3.5 m

Make sure that the connection of the tile floor to the façade of the house is lower than the level of the damp course in the wall.

Stagnant water is natural stone's worst enemy. For this reason, thought must be given to good drainage from the start. A porous foundation is very important. A slope must be installed to enable water to run off as much as possible, 1 to 2 cm per metre as a rule. The slope must be angled so that the water is carried away from the building.

When making the connection between the façade and the tiles, an expansion joint should be installed. The natural stone will expand in the sun and contract when cooling down or in frost. When the expansion joint is forgotten, the expansion and contraction of the tile cannot take place naturally and the tile will eventually break.

Thus foresee an expansion joint between the terrace and the facade. The expansion joint should be moisture-proof and elastic (frost-resistant kit or profile). Always adhere to the following rules regarding expansion joints for large terraces:

- Dark shades exposed to the sun: terrace greater than 25m² or a length of more than 5 m.

- Light shades exposed to the sun: terrace greater than 36m² or a length of more than 6 m.

- Dark shades not exposed to the sun: terrace greater than 36m² or a length of more than 8 m.

- Light shades not exposed to the sun: terrace greater than 36m² or a length of more than 10 m.

Please note: for strips regulations are more rigid. (see 5)

Never install tiles one against the other. With smooth surfaces, like Blue Stone, the joints can be rather narrow (4 to 5 mm). However, most natural stones are not so uniform and joints from 8 to 10 mm are not exceptional. For terraces, such a joint is necessary to enable the process of expansion and contraction to take place. Finally, grouting the joints would in most cases be impossible, as too much cement remains stuck to the rough surface. For this reason a grouting tool (thinnest: 5 mm) should be used. Avoid installing tiles with irregular or offset joints. Some materials in our range are sufficiently thick and hard wearing to allow for irregular or offset joints. Do not slide the tiles over each other or they may become scratched.

BWith the exterior installation of natural stones, do not forget to take

into consideration that, apart from the mechanical tensions to be imposed upon them, the most important influences on tiles are due to the climate. In particular, the sudden changes from damp to dry weather or from freezing to thawing conditions. In addition, various human activities, such as pedestrian and vehicular traffic, sudden impacts, etc., will have an effect on the exterior floor.

When working with slate and quartzite, the back of the tiles must be coated with a vinyl solution, composed of BELTRAMIX, white sand and white cement. This must be applied at least 24 hours before installation.

1. Installation on a cement drainage layer

For a terrace, the foundation must be laid under the frost line, around 40 cm below the level of the floor:

- a hardcore drainage foundation, firmly installed and dammed, of around 20 to 30 cm.
- granulated concrete of around 15 cm. Composition: 150 kg cement per m²


- of granules 8/22 or 10/20.
- stabilised sand bed of around 5 cm. Composition: washed river sand 0/5 or 0/7, mixed with white cement, slightly damp and well tamped in. Proportions: 9 parts sand to 1 part cement.
- mortar bed of maximum 3 cm. The tiles are laid fully in the mortar, not 'dotted'. Composition: white sand 0/2 mm mixed with white cement. Proportions: 4 parts sand to 1 part cement.
- Tiling

2. Installation on a concrete base

Avoid this method of installation because concrete holds stagnant water, which can freeze within the terrace. Additionally, concrete has a greater shrinkage coefficient which, in the long term, can cause cracks in the tiles. If, nevertheless, you have a concrete base structure, proceed as follows:

Lay a drainage mat on the concrete (e.g. a Trauba-plus from Schlüter). You can choose between 2 options to proceed:

A. Lay a reinforced bed with a minimum thickness of 5cm. Allow this top



layer to dry thoroughly (minimum 28 days). After this, coat the calibrated tiles (BELTRALINE) with a suitable adhesive (BELTRAFLEX) and lay them on the reinforced bed. The main advantage of this method is that the terrace has no contact with the base concrete and can therefore react to changing weather conditions.

B. On top of the drainage mat you continue with the traditional way of installing: stabilised sand bed, mortar and tiling. (see 1)


3. Installation on tile supports

This method is often used for roof terraces and balconies. However, it is also suitable for ground floor terraces provided it is not used by vehicles. N.B: for this method of installation the natural stone must have a minimum thickness: certainly no thinner than 3 cm, depending on the type

of material. The base must be completely level. Any unevenness can be corrected with roofing felt. The tile support determines the width of the joint.

4. Installation on mortar sacks

This method can be used in the same situations as for installation on tile supports. The tiles are laid on plastic sacks filled with mortar. You can decide for yourself the width of the grouting (minimum 4 to 5 mm). By using spacers, the perfect grout width can easily be controlled. As long as the mortar in the sacks does not harden, the tiles can be laid and levelled.



5. Installation of panels

Flooring

1. Installation on a cement drainage layer

- For a terrace or driveway the foundation must be laid under the frost line, around 40 cm below the level of the floor. (cfr Belgian Buidling & Research Institute magazine nr.4/1990)
- a hardcore drainage foundation, firmly installed and dammed, of around 20 to 30 cm.
- granulated concrete of around 15 cm. composition: 150 kg cement per m³ granules 8/22 of 10/20.
- stabilised sand bed of around 5 cm. composition: washed river sand 0/5 or 0/7 mm mixed with white cement, slightly damp and well tamped in. Proportions: 9 parts sand to 1 part cement. Mortar bed of maximum 3 cm. The tiles are laid fully in the mortar, not 'dotted'. Composition: white sand 0/2 mm mixed with white cement. Proportions: 4 parts sand to 1 part cement.
- Panels.

2. Installation on a concrete base:

- Avoid this method of installation on a concrete base, because concrete (not porous) holds stagnant water, which can freeze, within the terrace. Additionally, concrete has a greater shrinkage coefficient which in the long term, can cause cracks in the tiles. If, nevertheless, you have a concrete base structure, proceed as follows:
- Lay a drainage mat on the concrete (e.g. a Traubamat from Schlüter). You can choose between 2 options to proceed:
 - 2A Lay a reinforced bed with a minimum thickness of 5 cm. Allow this top layer to dry thoroughly (minimum 28 days). After this coat the strips with a suitable adhesive (BELTRAFLEX) and lay them on the reinforced bed. The main advantage of this method is that the terrace has no contact with the concrete base and can therefore react to changing weather conditions.
 - 2B On top of the drainage mat you continue with the traditional way of installing: stabilised sand bed, mortar and tiling. (see 1)

When fixing strips as an external floor, no matter which of the above method is chosen, you need to consider the following rule. If the surface is greater than 20 m² or a length of more than 3 m (exposed to the sun) or 5 m (not exposed to the sun), expansion joints across the stabilised sand and mortar bedding (1.) or the screed (2.) are indispensable. When making the connection between the façade and the strips an expansion joint must be installed. The expansion joint should be moisture- proof and elastic (frost-resistant kit of profile). The flooring must be installed with a slope of 1.5 % to enable water to run off as much as possible and the slope must be angled so that the water is carried away from the building. The connection of the strips with the façade needs to be lower than the water embankment membranes in the façade. The external joint widths are 4 to 6 mm. The grout is Beltrajoint.

Wall cladding

The strips are installed with Beltraflex (min 0,5 en max 1,5 cm thickness) on a dry and sufficient sticking background.

Double bounding is necessary, this means that both the back of the strips and the wall are covered with adhesive. The joints must be left open for several days (a minimum of 3 days when the weather is damp), so that the moist can evaporate through these joints. The thickness of the joints depends on the stone you use, please consult the technical data sheet of the material used. The grout is Beltrajoint. During the grouting it is important to clean the strips in order to avoid a cement film. The Stoneskin strips and the hand cleft strips are installed without joints.

6. Installation of B-Rocks

The B-rocks should be installed with Beltraflex (min 0,5 and max 1,5 cm thick) on a dry and sufficient sticking background. Double bonding is necessary, this means that both the back of the strips and the wall are covered fully with adhesive. When fixing as a wall cladding, make joints as close as possible as it is not recommended that the joints be grouted. For cladding corners we advise using the corner pieces. Do not sprinkle with water after fixing.

How can I maintain my outdoor porcelain tiles?

Porcelain tiles are manufactured with high-quality raw materials that are put under extremely high pressure and baked at very high temperatures. They can withstand freezing temperatures and are therefore suitable for all outdoor environments. Their low water absorption also makes porcelain outdoor tiles virtually maintenance-free. It is impossible for any dirt, moss or mould to stick to their surface.

You can achieve the very best long-term results by maintaining your patio tiles properly.

Step 1

After installation, clean your patio with **Lithofin KF Cement Residue Remover** to remove any grout haze and construction debris.

Step 2

Clean periodically with **Lithofin KF Intensive Cleaner** diluted in some water. Scrub, wait for 5 minutes and then rinse with water.



Tips

- Avoid the use of any sealers and oily maintenance products. Due to the porcelain tiles' low porosity, such products will form a greasy layer on the surface.
- Always follow the instructions on the packaging of the maintenance products.

Frequently asked questions

How can I remove barbecue grease stains from my patio tiles?

The rain and sun will make such stains disappear by themselves. If you want to remove the stains more quickly yourself, you can clean your patio with **Lithofin KF Intensive Cleaner**.

How can I remove stains made by leaves, fruit or soil from my patio tiles?

Lithofin MN Outdoor Cleaner has been specially developed for thoroughly cleaning outdoor stone surfaces, such as patios, paths and stairs. This maintenance product is perfect for removing discolouration or stains caused by trees, flowers or plants.

Installation of porcelain

General

- After delivery on site, the tiles must be adequately protected from wind and rain.
- Broken or damaged material is to be used where possible by sawing off the damaged part.
- Important: "Installation is acceptance": this means that after installation no complaints will be accepted, ex-cept for hidden faults.
- Carefully mix the tiles to achieve harmonious appearance of colours and shades.

Advice

- The joint between the tiles and the brickwork must be lower than the level of the damp proof course.
- Expansion joints are to be provided along all fixed elements around and on the patio: brick walls, kerbs, pillars etc.
- Provide adequate expansion joints: Surfaces exposed to the sun: every 20 m² or 4 linear metres. Surfaces not exposed to the sun: every 25 m² or 5 linear metres.
- Fit the tiles on a slope of 1.5% - away from the brickwork - to avoid stagnant water on the surface.
- The minimum joint width outdoors is 5 mm. Approximately 4 weeks after jointing, clean once only with a ce-ment residue remover (e.g. Lithofin KF cement residue remover) to get rid of any cement residue.

1. Installation on a wet bed

- Sub-foundation: minimum 15 cm of rubble, well rolled.
 - Foundation: lean or no fines concrete, minimum 10 cm.
- Composition: 150 kg cement per m³ - 8/22 or 10/20 granulate.
- Reinforced screed: minimum 5 cm. Composition: washed river sand (0/5 mm) mixed with max. 250 kg cement per m³ sand.
 - Apply adhesive to both surfaces (contact surface 100 %)
 - OCS Porcelain Tiles.

2. Installation on a concrete bed

- Foundation: traditional concrete bed
- Drainage mat + separation mat follow the manufacturer's installation instructions here
- Apply adhesive to both surfaces (contact surface 100 %)
- OCS Porcelain Tiles.

3. Installation on tile supports

- The surface on which the tile supports are placed must be sufficiently strong and load-bearing.
- Avoid water stagnation on the surface by, for example, providing a slope (± 2 cm per 1m).
- For square tiles larger than 60/60 cm, provide an extra tile support in the middle of the tile. Depending on the size, 6 to 8 tile supports are required for rectangular tiles.
